INTRODUCTION TO TARSI

Tanzania Road Safety Initiatives (TARSI) is a Non–Governmental Organization registered under the NGO Act, No. 24 of 2002 with a registration number 00NGO/R/3292. TARSI has been working through advocacy, capacity building, awareness raising on road safety through seminars, forums, dialogues, and training in alignment with the National Road Safety Strategy, Sustainable Development Goals, and World Health Organisation (WHO) mission on reducing the traffic accidents by 50% by 2030. TARSI already has a collaboration with other International Stakeholders on road safety issues like; the SADC Alliance of NGOs for Road Safety and the Global Alliance of NGOs for Road Safety.

In an effort to address the growing challenges of road safety and infrastructure integrity in Tanzania, the Tanzania Road Safety Initiative (TARSI), in collaboration with the Engineers Registration Board (ERB), has developed a critical training module titled "Engineering Safer Roads: Principles, Standards & Audit Practices." is the 5-day professional training is designed to equip engineers with essential knowledge and skills in road safety engineering, focusing on national design standards and practical safety audit methodologies. With Tanzania continuing to experience high rates of road crashes, this training provides a timely and vital opportunity to address safety challenges at the design and planning stage.

Participants will learn how to apply a systems thinking approach to road infrastructure, identify risks early in the project lifecycle, and implement internationally recognized audit practices. The training is facilitated by Tanzania Road Safety Initiatives (TARSI), a highly respected organization known for excellence in safety advocacy and technical capacity building in collaboration with leading institutions including the Ministry of Works, Ministry of Transport, TANROADS, TARURA, CH Design, and the Engineers Registration Board (ERB). Delivered by expert practitioners, this course ensures high technical value, practical relevance, and alignment with ERB's PDU requirements.

This program is particularly timely as Tanzania continues to invest in major road projects and urban transport systems. It serves as a platform to strengthen engineers' capacity to anticipate and address potential risks, reduce accident rates, and promote a culture of proactive safety in road engineering. Ultimately, this initiative contributes to national and global efforts to reduce traffic-related injuries and fatalities, aligning with the United Nations Decade of Action for Road Safety and Tanzania's own road safety strategies.

Certificate of Attendance

All participants who attend the training sessions will receive an official Certificate of Attendance, issued digitally by TARSI and endorsed by ERB and relevant partners. The certificate is awarded regardless of whether PDU qualification is achieved

Conditions to Qualify for PDUs

To be eligible for CPD Points (PDUs), a delegate must:

- Attend at least 80% of the total training time, equivalent to:
 - i) A minimum of 16 hours out of the 20 total training hours
 - ii) At least 4 out of the 5 training days
- Be marked present on the official daily attendance register.
- If a participant is unable to attend a session due to a valid reason, they must:
 - i) Inform the training coordinators in advance or within the same day
 - ii) Obtain a special access code to the recorded session
 - iii) Watch the full recorded session and complete the required session recap quiz to be credited with attendance for that day
- Actively participate in session activities such as guizzes, group discussions, or case reviews.

Important Notes:

- All attendance will be monitored electronically via login timestamps and manual headcounts during each session.
- PDUs will only be confirmed after a post-training attendance audit and evaluation form submission.
