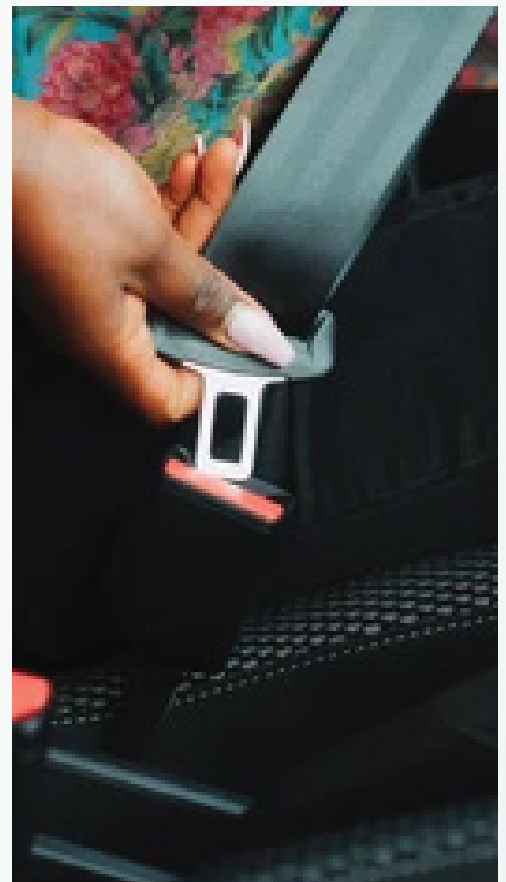

These accidents not only cause immense human suffering but also place a heavy burden on national economies through lost productivity, increased healthcare costs, and damage to infrastructure.

Recognizing the urgent need for action, the Tanzania Road Safety Initiative (TARSI) is proud to introduce its 15-Day International Training Program for Drivers, a comprehensive and specialized program designed to equip drivers from across Africa with the knowledge, skills, and professional discipline required to operate safely and responsibly on the roads. This training caters to drivers of various categories including commercial transport operators, bus and truck drivers, tour drivers, corporate chauffeurs, and government fleet operators ensuring that all participants gain practical, real-world competencies that directly contribute to reducing accidents and improving road safety.



Through a combination of classroom-based learning, hands on practical sessions, and exposure to modern safety technologies and regulations, participants will leave the program empowered to be champions of safe driving in their respective countries. TARSI's mission is not only to enhance individual driver performance but also to contribute to the creation of a safer, more efficient, and economically sustainable transport system across Africa the training will combine in-house sessions, practical exposure, and institutional visits, giving delegates a comprehensive understanding of road safety best practices.
